



Voting in an election

All countries try to encourage as many voters as possible to vote in elections. It is important to understand the different kinds of election and why they are so fundamental. There are national elections, where people vote for a political party to run the country. However, local council elections also have a significant effect on people's lives.



National elections are only held in democratic countries. A democracy is a country where all the people choose who will run the country. Most major countries in the world are now democratic, but there are many exceptions.

Democratic countries usually hold national elections every 3-5 years. All adults over 18 are entitled to go and vote for the political party they want to support. Some people don't bother because they think one or two votes are not going to make a difference. However, if enough people didn't bother, it would clearly make a difference. In any case, when people go to the polls to vote, they are normally voting for their local candidate and sometimes a few votes does make an important difference.

Now, we take it for granted that everyone can vote and that our individual choices do matter. But it has not always been that way. In the early stages of democracy, it was common for voting rights to be restricted to certain people. For example, New Zealand was the first country to allow all women to vote in national elections in 1893. Until then, only men had been able to vote. In the early stages of democracy, many countries also restricted voting to people of a certain age or social status.

Thankfully, most countries now recognise that every adult is entitled to vote for their national government or local councils. It is still important to encourage everyone to participate and use those rights.


